4. I should meditate on it.

Joshua 1:8 "This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success."

Psalm 1:2 "But his delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditate day and night."

5. I should obey it.

Deuteronomy 13:4 "Ye shall walk after the LORD your God, and fear him, and keep his commandments, and obey his voice, and ye shall serve him, and cleave unto him."

Can I trust my Bible?

- 1. Yes, the Word of God is inspired by <u>God</u>. 2 Timothy 3:16 "*All scripture is given by inspiration of God*..."
- 2. Yes, the Word of God is <u>pure</u>, so I can trust it. Proverbs 30:5 *"Every word of God is pure..."*

Psalm 119:140 "Thy word is very pure: therefore thy servant loveth it."

3. Yes, God promises to <u>preserve</u> His words to all generations. Psalm 12:6-7 "*The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever.*"

2 Timothy 1:13 "Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus."

4. Yes, because its prophecies have been <u>fulfilled</u> throughout history.

Acts 3:18 "But those things, which God before had shewed by the mouth of all his prophets, that Christ should suffer, he hath so fulfilled."

Who wrote the Bible?

God wrote the Bible, but used human instruments to record His words.

2 Timothy 3:16 "All scripture is given by inspiration of God ... "

2 Peter 1:21 "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."

When was the Bible written?

- 1. The Word of God existed in <u>Heaven</u> before the world began. Psalm 119:89 *"For ever, O LORD, thy word is settled in heaven."*
- 2. The Word of God is <u>eternal</u> and will never fade away. Matthew 24:35 *"Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away."*

I Peter 1:23 "...by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."

What can the Bible do for me?

1. It shows me how to get to <u>Heaven</u> from here.

2 Timothy 3:15 "And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus."

John 14:6 "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no

man cometh unto the Father, but by me."

- 2. It shows me how to <u>live</u> after I know I am going to Heaven. John 10:10 "...*I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.*"
- 3. It gives me <u>spiritual</u> understanding. Psalm 119:130 "The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple.

4. It shows me what is <u>right</u>. 2 Timothy 3:16 *"All scripture is giv*

2 Timothy 3:16 "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness."

5. It <u>changes</u> me. (Isaiah 55:10-11, Psalm 19:7-10)

Why should I read the Bible?

- 1. The Word of God will <u>increase</u> my faith. Romans 10:17 "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of *God*."
- 2. The words of God are <u>spiritual</u> food. Matthew 4:4 "...*Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.*"
- 3. God's Word gives me <u>examples</u> by which to live. I Corinthians 10:11 "Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come."
- 4. It gives me <u>knowledge</u>, wisdom, <u>comfort</u>, and hope. Romans 15:4 *"For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope."*

What should be my relationship with the Word of God?

- 1. I should <u>love it</u>. Psalm 119:97 "O how love I thy law! it is my meditation all the day."
- 2. I should read it.

Nehemiah $\overline{9:3}$ "And they stood up in their place, and read in the book of the law of the LORD their God one fourth part of the day; and another fourth part they confessed, and worshipped the LORD their God."

3. I should study it.

2 Timothy 2:15 "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."
