- 2 Peter 3:18 "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen."
- 3. Involve yourself in opportunities to <u>serve</u>.

 1 Corinthians 15:58 "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord."
- 4. Be thoughtful and thankful for your fellow Christians.

 I Thessalonians 5:12-13 "And we beseech you, brethren, to know them which labour among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you; And to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. And be at peace among yourselves."
- 5. Familiarize <u>yourself</u> with the spiritual gifts. Romans 12:6-8, I Corinthians 12:6-8, Ephesians 4:11
- 6. Evaluate the <u>fulfillment</u> you receive by contributing to the body of Christ.

I Thessalonians 2:11-12 "As ye know how we exhorted and comforted and charged every one of you, as a father doth his children, That ye would walk worthy of God, who hath called you unto his kingdom and glory."

7. Consider the <u>confirmation</u> received by others.

Proverbs 18:16 "A man's gift maketh room for him, and bringeth him before great men."

Spiritual Gifts

What is a spiritual gift?

1. A divine empowerment from God's Spirit which enables me to serve God through the <u>local church</u> in a special and <u>specific</u> way.

I Corinthians 12:7 "But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to prof-

I Corinthians 12:7 "But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal"

I Peter 4:10 "As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God."

2. A spiritual gift, just as salvation, is freely given and cannot be <u>earned</u>. I Corinthians 2:12 "Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God."

What are the purposes for the spiritual gifts?

- 1. To bring glory to God by helping individual people.
 - A. By fulfilling my God-given <u>purpose</u> in the church.

 I Corinthians 12:18 "But now hath God set the members every one of them in the body, as it hath pleased him."
 - B. By <u>assisting</u> other members of the church.
 I Corinthians 12:25 "...but that the members should have the same care one for another."
 - C. By cooperating with other church members who have <u>different</u> spiritual gifts. I Corinthians 12:26 "And whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it; or one member be honoured, all the members rejoice with it."
- 2. To bring glory to God by helping guide the church itself.

Ephesians 4:11-12 "And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the minisrty, for the edifying of the body of Christ:"

With the church in mind, God gave these gifts to the church for:

- A. The perfecting (maturing) of the saints.
- B. The work of the ministry (service).
- C. The edifying (building) of the church.

Who decides what gifts I get?

1. The <u>Father</u> is the source of all gifts.

James 1:17 "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning."

2. The <u>Spirit</u> of God chooses what spiritual gifts are best for each believer

I Corinthians 12:11 "But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will."

What are the seven practical spiritual gifts?

Romans 12:6-8 "Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith; Or ministry, let us wait on our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching; Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness."

1. Prophecy

Description: the gift of emphasizing and proclaiming God's pure truth to people **Benefit in church**: keeps an emphasis on soul winning and purity.

Bible Example: Peter

2. Ministering

Description: the gift to identify and practically help others by willing service.

Benefit in church: encourages a spirit of involvement.

Bible Example: Timothy

3. Teaching

Description: the gift to effectively research and/or communicate the truths of the Bible to others.

Benefit in church: provides meaningful and useful resources.

Bible Example: Luke

4. Exhortation

Description: the gift to identify root problems, straighten, and strengthen others to a place of spiritual maturity.

Benefit in church: helps people through difficult times using Scripture as their guide.

Bible Example: Paul

5. Giving

Description: the gift to conserve and share resources in order to meet material needs

Benefit in church: finding resources and using them for eternal purposes.

Bible Example: Matthew

6. Ruling

Description: the gift to guide and direct a group of people toward a goal or destination.

Benefit in church: growth and completion of projects.

Bible Example: Nehemiah

7. Mercy

Description: the gift to recognize, identify with, and comfort those who are hurting.

Benefit in church: unity within the church and a compassionate spirit.

Bible Example: John

How do I find and use my spiritual gifts?

1. Seek the <u>filling</u> of the Holy Spirit.

Ephesians 5:18 "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit;

2. Grow in grace.
